1. Opening of the Meeting

The Online Meeting No. 29 of the Global Punjabi Association (GPA) was convened as per the directives of **Hon'ble Dr. Iqbal Singh Lalpura Ji, Patron GPA**, and **Dr. Kulwant Singh Dhaliwal Ji, President GPA**, to express collective grief, pay homage to the victims of the **Pahalgam Terror Attack**, and reaffirm solidarity with the affected families and the nation.

The meeting commenced at **6:30 P.M.**

2. Welcome and Context Setting

The meeting was initiated with a warm welcome to all **Office Bearers, Executive Members, Life Members, Honorary Members, and General Members** of the Association. The Chair briefly outlined the purpose of the meeting, emphasizing that the gathering was not merely procedural but a moral and humanitarian response to an act of violence that shook the conscience of society.

It was stated that terrorism, in any form and for any cause, is a grave threat to peace, human dignity, and democratic values, and the Global Punjabi Association stands firmly against such acts.

3. Tribute and Homage to the Victims

The House observed a **two-minute silence** in solemn remembrance of those who lost their lives in the Pahalgam Terror Attack. Members stood united in silence, offering prayers for:

- Eternal peace to the departed souls
- Strength, courage, and resilience to the bereaved families
- Speedy recovery of those injured in the attack

The moment reflected deep sorrow as well as collective resolve.

4. Deliberations and Expressions of Solidarity

During the deliberations, members expressed:

- Strong condemnation of the terror attack and violence against innocent civilians
- Deep anguish over the loss of precious human lives
- Unwavering solidarity with the victims, their families, and the people affected

Speakers highlighted that Punjab and the Punjabi diaspora have always upheld values of **peace, brotherhood, secularism, and humanism**, and terrorism is fundamentally opposed to these ideals.

It was emphasized that such acts aim to create fear and division, but unity, compassion, and collective resolve are the strongest responses.

5. Key Observations

The following key observations emerged during the discussion:

- Terrorism has no religion, no nationality, and no justification.
 - Civil society organizations like GPA have a moral duty to raise voices for peace and harmony.
 - Dialogue, education, and social unity are essential to counter hatred and extremism.
 - The need to stand with constitutional values and the rule of law was strongly reaffirmed.

 2. To express heartfelt condolences to the families of the victims and solidarity with the injured.

 4. To convey GPA's sentiments and prayers to the concerned authorities and affected families through an appropriate communication.
